

## Sinan Guloksuz, Assistant Professor

Dr. Guloksuz is an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at the Department of Psychiatry and Neuropsychology at Maastricht University, and Adjunct Assistant Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at the Department of Psychiatry, Yale University School of Medicine. He earned his M.D. degree from Gazi University, Turkey, and M.Sc. and Ph.D. degrees from Maastricht University, the Netherlands. His PhD project investigated the biological mechanisms of environmental stressors in psychiatry, with a particular focus on the immune system. He is a proud alumnus of the psychiatry training program at Bakirkoy Research and Training Hospital for Psychiatry, Neurology, and Neurosurgery in Istanbul, Turkey.

With a background in clinical psychiatry and translational epidemiology, Dr. Guloksuz's broader research focus has been on understanding the mechanisms underlying psychosis spectrum disorder and investigating gene–environment interactions at the convergence of multidimensional psychopathology in large epidemiological samples. He has published over 80 peer-reviewed publications and 10 book chapters. He is the recipient of European Union's Spinoza Scholarship and various awards from the APA, SOBP, EPA, WPA, EFPT, and TPD.
