James Stone

Dr. Stone trained in Medicine at the Royal Free Hospital School of Medicine where he took an intercalated BSc in Neuroscience. After completing his medical degree, he specialised in Psychiatry, initially in Cambridge and then moving to the Maudsley Hospital, London, in 2000. He completed a PhD investigating the role of glutamate in psychosis using single photon emission tomography and proton magnetic resonance spectroscopy. Following this, he worked at Imperial College London, continuing research into the role of glutamatergic abnormalities in psychosis. Between 2013 and August 2020, Dr Stone returned as a Clinical Senior Lecturer to the Institute of Psychiatry, Psychology and Neuroscience at King's College London, where his research focused on experimental medicine and clinical trials. During his time there he also set up the ketamine clinic at the Maudsley Hospital for patients with treatment resistant depression. Dr Stone moved to Brighton and Sussex Medical School as Reader in Psychiatry in September 2020. In the last 2 years he has set up a ketamine clinic at Eastbourne District General Hospital, and is leading research projects investigating the treatment of depressive symptoms with ketamine, probiotics and fMRI neurofeedback.
